She and her two daughters Shamia, 9 and Marisah, 13 will live in one of the two homes. "Thank you Habitat. You are now our family too."

### Volunteer Spotlight: Bill Cinquini





f you are a Napa resident, you may have seen or heard of Bill Cinquini. Perhaps you're aware of his involvement with the California Grand Jury Association, or maybe you know him as the past president of the local Kiwanis Club, or for his work on projects for the Enchanted Hills Camp for the Blind. For the past five years, we here at Solano-Napa Habitat for Humanity know Bill because of his tireless efforts as our Napa County Volunteer Coordinator as well as being a build site volunteer himself.

Habitat for Humanity has always been on Bill's radar, but it was thanks to a close friend that he became connected with the local affiliate. He quickly stepped in and helped where needed, and now finds and places volunteers on construction projects and other various tasks. Volunteers are the lifeblood of the organization, and Bill's role is a vital part of what makes it run smoothly. Volunteer tasks are as varied as the projects themselves, and Bill wants the community to know there is a job for everyone.

"Many have a picture of someone with a hard-hat, hammer in hand, building a floor or wall for a new home," said Cinquini, who describes a typical Habitat build. But in Napa, the tasks are much more varied. "Habitat has taken on various home rehabilitation projects to enable a homeowner to stay in their home by improving it and making it safe. This has involved many hours of volunteer service from yard clean up to installing new windows, expanding a bathroom to provide wheelchair access, flooring installation, and interior and exterior painting. To list just a few!"

"Fear is no excuse to stay home," says Cinquini, who recalled a woman with a "can-do" attitude who learned to use tools for the first time at one of her volunteer assignments. "Come out for the joy of helping a family or an individual live in a safe home, to learn a new skill, or to meet other volunteers and enjoy being a part of a very meaningful experience."

For over 25 years, Habitat for Humanity has been part of the national coalition of nonprofit organizations active in disaster recovery. In recent years, Habitat has become a primary recovery agency whenever and wherever disasters strike. Locally, SNHFH has been one of the key organizations in advocating for survivors with ongoing unmet needs and soon in providing critical repairs. After all national and other local funds were distributed, several hundred families in the Napa area and in Vallejo continued to have unmet disaster-related needs. Fortunately, many have now received additional assistance, but some are still waiting for help. When we've completed our repairs for the 8 low-income families that are already under our care, we will work with other local agencies to continue this important work.

# Napa's First Ground-Up Home

We are happy to announce that we will be building our first groundup home in Napa! The City Council has approved our purchase of a piece of surplus property that was offered for sale last year. The property was made available for the development of housing for low and moderate income families, and our Board of Directors has approved the purchase of the lot.

As soon as we have finalized the sale documents, we will begin our Capital Campaign to raise the monies necessary to start building. Stay tuned for updates on corporate sponsorship opportunities, family selection plans and volunteer scheduling.

Up to this point in Napa, our affiliate has only had the opportunity to help low-income seniors, veterans or the disabled with necessary repairs to enable them to "age in place" and stay in their homes. We are excited to be able to help a deserving family become first-time Habitat homeowners in Napa County!

### New 4-Bedroom Home Planned in Vallejo

abitat plans to break ground on a new house build in the City of Vallejo this summer! The affiliate found a reasonably priced, vacant, residential lot and the purchase is complete. A former board member and resident of Vallejo was instrumental in making this happen. In order to help Habitat make this an affordable project, we have submitted an application to the City of Vallejo for federal housing money to fund the property acquisition. If we are successful in getting this funding we will ensure the affordability of the house starting out, and we can focus our attention on fund raising for construction. If unsuccessful with the application, the build will go forward but we will have to focus our attention first on raising funds to complete the property purchase.

Now, some really exciting news! Because of the larger size of this lot in Vallejo (compared to our usual, 3,000 to 4,000 square foot lots on which we have built) we are going to "step up our game" and build a larger house. The Board of Directors recently approved moving ahead with a 4-bedroom, 2 bath house. Our usual build is a "3/2." This project will allow us to possibly select a large family who, most likely, today is living under extreme over-crowded conditions. Keep your eyes open for this exciting project in Vallejo.

# Napa Valley Give!Guide Raises \$14,445

### Vietnam Veteran Receives Home Repairs

n the Spring and Summer of 2015 we worked on the Pine Street home of Eric, a Vietnam War Veteran. Hard-working volunteers filled his home and helped make it safe, allowing Eric to age in place. An electrical contractor who served two tours in Vietnam, Eric was honorably discharged. He suffers from war-related injuries, and the long-term effects have made it difficult for him to continue working and have resulted in chronic health issues.

To quote Eric: "I had hit bottom with my health and, hence, my life. after four surgeries. When I hit bottom I asked the Lord for help many times over and he sent me a crew of angels known as Habitat volunteers."

To ensure that Eric's home was safe, sanitary and up to code, repairs were made to the home's sewer lines and a new roof and gutters were installed. Our teams also painted and weatherized the home's exterior, installed new weather-efficient windows and doors, remodeled the kitchen with new cabinets, flooring and appliances, and did general yard and landscape clean-up.

With many hours of volunteer labor and donated materials, the work done enabled Eric to secure a reverse mortgage on his home, now ensuring his being able to live there for as long as he wishes.

# **ReStore Update**

Our ReStore has experienced unbelievable growth since it opened four years ago.

In August 2015, we added an additional 4,000 square feet of retail space, and on April 1 of this year, we will take over the entire building, doubling our original size. As a result of this "great news", we now need to increase the number of volunteers who staff the store. If you are looking for a fun, rewarding place to volunteer, come join our team. We are open Tuesdays thru Saturdays, from 9am to 5pm, with two 4-hour shifts each day. We'd love to have you join us in any way you can - to assist customers, process donations, cashier or help stock the store with the donations received. It's up to you!

And with more floor space comes the need for more donations from all sources including businesses, contractors, property managers and individual homeowners. Part of our success is due to two of our most popular programs, our Downsizing Program which reaches out to seniors who are moving into smaller residences and need to donate excess furniture, and our Deconstruction Program where our volunteers carefully remove cabinets and appliances from homes undergoing remodeling, with the items then sold at ReStore.
