A Message from Our Board President

2017 has been a busy, productive and rewarding period of time for Solano-Napa Habitat for Humanity (SNHfH). As I write this, I'm looking back with a sense of pride in what has been accomplished. I look to the future with determination to deal with on-going changes in our organization and at this very moment the disaster recovery efforts on the horizon in Napa County. Let's start with a look back...

ReStore celebrated its sixth anniversary and continues to be one of the strongest financial contributors to the affiliate. We are now comfortably "at home" in all 16,000 square feet of the building and even have plans to make it "our own."

We presented three very successful fundraising events for our Dixon, Napa and Vallejo projects. In Dixon we partnered with the Rotary and First Methodist Church to host a dinner and concert to benefit the future "Veteran's Project," a home which will provide permanent housing for six veterans. In Napa, we held a "Paella" party to support our first new home build on Saratoga Drive; and in Vallejo, we presented "Habitat by the Bay," a dinner and silent auction held at the California Maritime Academy. We are already planning a repeat event for 2018!

SNHfH was fortunate to be able to partner with The Home Depot Foundation to complete major site repairs and improvements at the Veteran's Home in Yountville. We provided site supervisors for some 300 volunteers, and Home Depot made a significant financial contribution as well as providing

building materials and tools. Thank you Home Depot!

It was with great pride that SNHfH accepted Senate District 3's "2017 California Nonprofit of the Year" award from State Senator Bill Dodd. Construction is well underway on our Vallejo build, which will be home to the Ponds family. In Napa, the foundation has been poured and framing will soon begin. After completing the rigorous Family Selection process, the Board selected the Hernandez/Trejo family. You can read more about these two projects within this newsletter. In Dixon, we've done significant site work and hope to begin construction next year. Fundraising continues for all three builds.

Looking forward, we are planning for new projects in Rio Vista, Fairfield, Vacaville and Napa. We will continue to look for Critical Repair projects but funding sources for these is always a challenge. No stone goes unturned in our search for building opportunities. That brings us to another big challenge, the search for a new Executive Director.

After six years "at the helm," our Executive Director, Diane Agnone, will be retiring at the end of the year. During the years she's been with us, SNHfH has become a stable, well-respected and productive organization. We will greatly miss Diane and wish her well in retirement!

Now, as I close, I want to say "thank you!" With you – our donors, volunteers, staff and board members – Solano-Napa Habitat for Humanity is able to provide tangible proof that we can become, as Habitat International envisions: "A world where everyone has a decent place to live."

Yountville Veterans Project

n May, Solano-Napa Habitat for Humanity (SNHfH) partnered with The Home Depot Foundation, The Tug McGraw Foundation, and The Center for Volunteer and Nonprofit Leadership (CVNL), to complete major site repairs and improvements at the Veteran's Home in Yountville in Napa County. Our organization provided 60 site supervisors for some 300 volunteers. The Home Depot volunteers consisted of store employees and vendors who built more than 100 structures including picnic tables, sun shades, benches, and planter boxes. Whether walking the grounds or sitting down to eat lunch, these structures will allow the veterans to better enjoy



the beautiful surroundings. In addition, Home Depot made a contribution of building materials and tools to SNHfH and a significant financial contribution in recognition

sweat equity hours and pay a no-interest mortgage on the home before it officially becomes theirs. "When you called and told me we had been chosen, I knew in that moment our life had changed," said Viviana.

Site clearing and foundation work on the lot on Saratoga Drive is now completed, and framing is underway. The two-story, 1,352-square-foot house will include 3 bedrooms, 2½ baths, and a two car garage. Fundraising for this project is continuing, and we are asking the Napa community for one last push to help raise the final funds needed to complete this home for this local, deserving family.

"We are starting a new journey on to bigger and better things" said Roberto. "My family will finally have a home of our own, and I hope we can be a model for future Habitat families."

The family's son Jayden also added to the family's hopeful sentiments; "I'm so happy I can finally have a dog!"

Support for Orphans and Vulnerable Groups (OVG) in Lesotho

In September 2016, I spent a week in the Southern African country of Lesotho to review the impact our tithe funds were having on the Orphans and Vulnerable Groups (OVG) families served by Habitat for Humanity Lesotho (HFHL). Our group, made up of seven leaders from Habitat affiliates across the country, was hosted by HFHL's



National Director, Mathabo Makuta, and her dedicated staff.

We learned about the critical need of OVGs in Lesotho, including that the country has the second highest HIV/ AIDS prevalence in the world, and nearly 25% of Basotho children are orphans. We spoke with Habitat

homeowners (many of them orphans) about what owning their own decent place to live meant to them. After listening to their stories, we learned that without exception, home ownership had transformed their lives. We saw how HFHL collaborates with local chieftains to identify OVG families in need, and how they ensure that Habitat homeowners have a legal right to their houses – part of a Habitat global advocacy campaign for secure property rights called Solid Ground.

Witnessing the impact a simple Habitat house had on the lives of the families HFHL serves, many of them child-led, was inspiring. Knowing that our organization's work here locally has helped make many of those houses possible, gave me an overwhelming sense of the impact each one of our employees and volunteers is having right here in Northern California and around the world.

In April, we hosted Ms. Makuta here in the Bay Area so she could see how Solano-Napa Habitat for Humanity builds houses for local families in need of a safe, decent, and affordable place to live.
